

Re: Petition For Hallett's Pond Name Change

Dear Commissioners:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide input relative to the renaming of Hallett's Pond to Lake Hallett. The City of Saint Peter believes that a change of this type provides no benefit to the County, City or its citizens.

Parcels of land that are included as a one-time gravel pit are owned by specific property owners including the City of Saint Peter and others. The City owns the vast majority of the land and has plans for the surrounding property that includes a trail, dock and improved access. As supported by the Saint Peter Parks and Recreation Advisory Board and City Council, there are no plans for the purchase of additional land to expand the City park system and we do not believe that a change in the name will enhance opportunities for grant funding should others pursue it. Please also know that this will not change the Parks Plan or the Comprehensive (land use) Plan for the City.

A change in the name may further confuse future users about the exact legal nature of the body of water as a Class 5 Wetland. We wonder whether the County or other instrumentality of the State has standing to change the name of property that the State or other State instrumentally has no underlying property right in. The State or its instrumentalities certainly may name streets, rivers, and/or bodies of water that it owns, but this property is held privately by multiple owners. This fact makes the application of this renaming process one that should be investigated further.

The City of Saint Peter and its Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, as the owner of the majority of the shore and underlying property, continued the use of "Hallett's Pond" even when asked to use alternative names. The Saint Peter Chamber of Commerce, a member based organization representing business interests, has used the name "Hallett's Pond" in its promotional advertisement publications. The Nicollet County Sheriff's Office has referred to the site as "Hallett's Pond" in it advertisements for the annual Polar Bear Plunge. Maps prepared by municipal, county and state agencies, have identified the body of water as "Hallett's Pond". Any assertion that there is confusion about the name or use of the Pond has been substantially overstated.

The City further believes that a change in the name has additional incremental costs including changing the mapping at City, County and State levels.

Lastly, the current name, "Hallett's Pond", pays appropriate respect to the history of the family and company that mined gravel there. It seems clear that no matter the name that is applied to this accidentally constructed, manmade body of water, the historic name of Hallett's Pond will remain its most used descriptor. It is unlikely that any change will impact our local, common language use. A name change will add confusion to what you all know as Hallett's Pond.

Thank you for your time and commitment to the process.








Hallett's Pond Area

County Board says no to Lake Hallett

ST. PETER — A petition to officially name a small body of water in St. Peter was rejected Tuesday by the Nicollet County Board.

The Lake Hallett Association had requested that the informally named Hallett's Pond receive the name Lake Hallett to distinguish it from its generic state designation as Lake 52-1.

The Board recommended that the city of St. Peter could suggest a name because the city has assumed possession of the pond, but City Administrator Todd Prafke said a name change likely would result in additional confusion regarding the body of water and surrounding land uses.

Thank you for the notice of a public hearing on February 24, 2009 to consider a petition to rename a lake in your county. The following is offered as findings and recommendations pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 83A.07 subd. 2.

The subject basin, DNR ID number 52-1 wetland, is located in Section 16, Township 110 North, Range 26 West in the city of St. Peter and is presently unnamed according to the DNR Public Waters Inventory for Nicollet County (1987). The petitioners are seeking to name the basin "Lake Hallett" after E.W. Hallett who passed away in 1983.

There is no geographic feature named "Hallett" in the state of Minnesota according to the U.S. Geological Survey's Geographic Names Information System. "Lake Hallett" would be a unique geographic name for Minnesota, and would be acceptable to the DNR.

According to M.S. 83A.06, legal voters in Nicollet County may propose different names for the lake during the public hearing. If the county board should favor an alternative name, please check the DNR Public Waters Inventory for Nicollet County for potential duplication before adopting the alternative name in the form of a resolution.
